Course Description

A survey of Western art and architecture from Renaissance times until the Present. Selected works are examined through visual presentations, lectures, and readings..

Course Objectives

- Students will develop an introductory understanding of selected visual expressions from Renaissance times until the Present;
- Develop the skill to “see” the connections between various styles and artistic vocabularies;
- Relate visual expressions with the cultural context in which they were created; and
- Develop skills in visual analysis, comparative analysis, and writing.

Attendance
